The April 15, 2025 issue of *Old Cars* magazine arrived, containing the annual announcement of their Golden Quill Awards. Ten of the last eleven years we have been the recipient of this award! For 2024 they added a new category: **Exemplary.**

"Winners of the *Old Cars* Golden Quill Award for 2024 have been carefully selected based on each publication's ability to meet the needs and preferences of club members while maintaining a high integrity in content, creativity, information, accuracy, design, variety, technical ideas and overall feel." All publications for consideration have to be submitted in print form, rather than electronic submissions. "Otherwise, it is like comparing bananas with watermelons. ... It just doesn't work right. Quality in printing and color rendition are among the judged values for professional quality."

Regarding this new Exemplary category, the editors noted: "On occasion, speciality and regional publications make significant progress in content, design and scope, thus raising the level of interest in their segments of the collector car field. These publications admirably represent the hobby and deserve special recognition as *innovative beacons in their fields.*" (Emphasis added) There were 139 publications so honored: National, Regional, and Chapters, of the thousands of automobile clubs in existence. There were three National, and 18 Chapter publications in the Exemplary category.

Our own *Occasional* is one of the 21 so honored in the Exemplary category! Sherry and I want to thank *everyone* who contributes suggestions, photos, and articles to our publication, which makes such an honor possible. We could not do this without your help. And our thanks to the judges, who understand the economics of the need for our moving from color to black and white photos for our print version. The extra work involved in changing from color in our digital version to black and white for the print version is a major headache. But that maintains the quality of the print publication.





MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OF THE MODEL T FORD CLUB OF GREATER ST. LOUIS FRIDAY, MARCH 14, 2005

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Steven Williams. Members present were: President Steven Williams, Vice President Kent Gilbane, Treasurer Bonnie Dattoli, Secretary Ruth Baker and Directors Don Spaeth, Keith Sanders, Daniel Mullis, Stephen Heatherly, Jerry Ellerbeck, Sr., Jerry Ellerbeck, Jr., and Scott Francis. Sam Atkinson arrived at 6:35 p.m.

Minutes of the meeting of Friday, February 14, 2025 were read. Treasurer Bonnie Dattoli stated that President Steven Williams had the bill from Steve Dodson. Kent Gilbane made the motion to approve the minutes as amended. The motion was seconded by Don Spaeth and carried unanimously, with no objections

Treasurer Bonnie Dattoli gave the Treasurer's Report. Kent Gilbane made the motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. The motion was seconded by Keith Sanders, and carried unanimously, with no objections.




